In-Class Exercise (Odyssey Of the Mind In-class Spontaneous) Spring 2016 17-March

- 1. I need **four** volunteers to be judges.
- 2. The others need to divide yourselves into groups of **five** or **six** and gather around a table.
- 3. I will assign a judge to each table, who will start by writing down everyone's names on a sheet of paper.
- 4. The people at the table will take turns naming an **excise task** ... it could be related to school, using a computer, or anything else in your life.
- 5. The judge will score each answer as either *creative* (worth 2 points), *common* (worth 1 point), or a *repeat* (worth 0 points).
- 6. You must take turns **in order**. If someone is stuck, the team is stuck. You **must wait** until that person gives a response.
 - Strategy: If you're stuck, repeat an answer. It's worth 0 points but keeps the line moving.
- 7. The table with the highest score wins the prize.
- 8. Start when I say go, stop when I say stop.
- 9. To the judges:

- Do not try to keep track of every answer, just the points.
- A common answer is something obvious or very similar to a previous answer.
- o If you're not sure a response is excise, you can ask for a clarification.
- If you decide a response is not excise, score it as a common answer.
